Not My Problem

Paul was not bragging when he talked about the toil and drudgery he endured while proclaiming the gospel. He makes a point of his working so as not to burden anyone. He worked to support himself, rather than asking the new Christians to support him—just the opposite of what the scribes and Pharisees were doing, according to the gospel. Jesus accused them of laying heavy burdens on people, without helping them to bear those burdens. So what kind of burdens did the Pharisees impose?

The Pharisees and scribes were very familiar with the laws of their Jewish religion. Almost every detail of daily life was covered by some law. Originally those laws and regulations were meant to set the Hebrews apart from other peoples, to be a sign of holiness. But over the years, rabbis added more and more details to the laws, until it was almost impossible to keep them all straight.

But what if someone needed help on a Sabbath? If you broke a Sabbath rule, even for a good reason, you could not go to the Pharisees to get an exemption. They would say, “Not my problem.”

Jesus, however, came to remind us that holiness is more important than scrupulosity. If we truly live the ideal of loving God with our whole being and loving our neighbor, we will find that love is much easier to bear than the fear of doing something wrong. Jesus also gave us his Holy Spirit to help guide us in the path of holiness. And through his death on the cross, Jesus gave us forgiveness if we do commit a sin. So keeping the law of love is no problem.

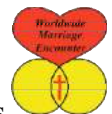

2017 National Vocations Awareness Week

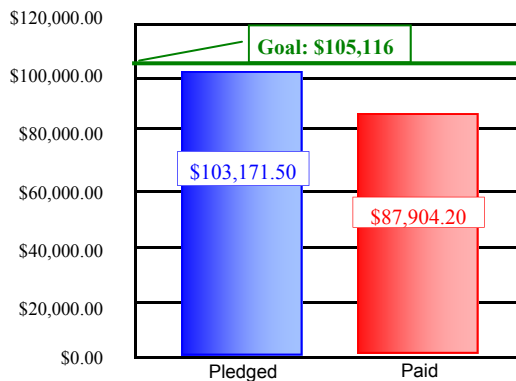

Bienvenidos a la Parroquia St. Francisco de Asís!

Damos una especial bienvenida a todos los visitantes y nuevos feligreses que han venido hoy a celebrar la Misa con nosotros! Si usted es nuevo en nuestra comunidad, por favor preséntese a nuestro clero. Si usted vive en esta área y asiste regularmente, le invitamos a unirse a nuestra parroquia. La inscripción de su familia nos ayuda a tener una administración más eficaz de las llamadas por enfermos, asuntos relacionados con el bautismo, la educación, el matrimonio y otros sacramentos.

La inscripción es muy fácil, y las tarjetas verdes de "Registro parroquial" se pueden encontrar en el portafolio ubicado en la entrada de la parroquia. Después de completarla, por favor, colóquela en el buzón ubicado en la puerta al lado de la fuente de agua en el vestíbulo.

El Señor nos hace un retrato de la clase preparada de Israel, los fariseos y los maestros de la Ley.

A pesar de todo su conocimiento, viven de una manera superficial la fe, son solo apariencia, lo que hacen no es buscando realmente la Gloria de Dios y la salvación de sus hermanos, hacen las cosas: «para ser vistos por los hombres» (Mt 23,5).

Son incoherentes, «dicen y no hacen» (Mt 23,3), son esclavos de su propio engaño al buscar la aprobación y la admiración de los hombres. De esto depende su consistencia. Por sí mismos no son más que patética vanidad, orgullo absurdo, vaciedad... necedad

Continuamos escuchando la tentación de la serpiente que nos invita a aparentar, a querer ser más de lo que en realidad somos, que continúa susurrándonos al oído: «El día en que coman del fruto del árbol que está en medio del jardín, se les abrirán los ojos y serán como dioses, conocedores del bien y del mal» (Gn 3,5). Y continuamos cayendo en ello, nos hacemos llamar: "rabí", "padre" y "guías"... y tantos otros calificativos. Queremos ocupar el lugar que no nos corresponde. Es la actitud farisaica.

Los discípulos de Jesús no han de ser así, al contrario: «El mayor entre ustedes que sea su servidor» (Mt 23,11). Y como que tenemos un único Padre, todos somos hermanos. El Evangelio nos deja claro que no podemos desvincular la dimensión vertical (Padre) y la horizontal (nuestro), «amarás al Señor, tu Dios (...). Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo» (Mt 22,37.39).

La liturgia de la Palabra está llena por la ternura y la exigencia de la filiación y de la fraternidad. Resuena en nuestro corazón las palabras de san Juan: «Si alguno dice: 'Amo a Dios', y aborrece a su hermano, es un mentiroso» (1Jn 4,20).

La nueva evangelización nos pide fidelidad, confianza y sinceridad a nuestra vocación bautismal, para no vivir como los fariseos, hablando de una manera y viviendo de otra.

Desde la oración sobre las ofrendas hasta el momento del Santo. Durante el Padre Nuestro hasta el Cordero. Oración después de la comunión hasta la despedida de la Misa.

Sentados: durante las lecturas. Durante la homilía y durante el silencio que debe guardarse al terminar la homilía. Mientras se hace la preparación de los dones en el ofertorio. A lo largo del sagrado silencio que se debe guardar después de la comunión.

De rodillas: De la consagración al gran Amén y después del Cordero de Dios.

¿EN LA MISA HAY MOMENTOS DE SILENCIO?

Sí, hay cuatro momentos de silencio importantes.

¿CUANDO SON ESOS MOMENTOS?

Un primer momento:

Al principio de la Misa cuando el sacerdote nos invita a reconocer nuestros pecados.

Un segundo momento:

Cuando el Sacerdote nos invita a orar diciendo "oremos" al principio de la Misa, a esa oración se le llama oración colecta

Un tercer momento:

Después de la Homilía.

Un cuarto momento:

Después de recibir la Sagrada Comunión.

Sabías que:

¿Por qué los Papas cambian su nombre?

Cuando Jorge Mario Bergoglio, fue elegido el Papa 266, Marzo 13, 2013, escogió otro nombre, Francisco. ¿Por qué hizo esto?

Lo hizo siguiendo una antigua tradición. El primer Papa se llamaba Simón y Jesús le cambió el nombre a Pedro. Pero esto no tiene nada que ver con la costumbre de tomar otro nombre.

En el año 533 fue elegido Papa el Obispo Mercurio. Como era el nombre de un dios pagano, creyó que no era conveniente que el Vicario de Cristo en la tierra fuese llamado así, y tomó el nombre de Juan. Y como había habido un Papa Juan, se le llamó Juan II.

Esta costumbre de Juan II no fue imitada por sus sucesores, pero en el año 1009 fue elegido un Obispo que se llamaba Pedro, y como no se consideraba digno de ser llamado igual que el primer Papa, adoptó el nombre de Sergio IV (ya que habían habido tres papas con el mismo nombre antes). Desde entonces, esta ha sido una sólida tradición en nuestra Iglesia.
