Today's Readings

First Reading — You shall not oppress an alien, for you yourselves were once aliens in Egypt (Exodus 22:20-26).

Psalm — I love you, Lord, my strength (Psalm 18).

Second Reading — You became imitators of the Lord, so that you became a model for all believers (1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10).

Gospel — You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and you shall love your neighbor as yourself (Matthew 22:34-40).

Balance

Today's scriptures emphasize the fundamental link between love of God and love of our neighbors, especially those who are most in need. Love of God should compel us to love the people whom God cherishes. Conversely, work for justice and charity for those in need should be rooted in our love of God. That connection and balance, however, isn't always easy to maintain in our lives. Even in religious orders we find that some Christians are more oriented toward contemplation and prayer, while others are more active in reaching out to those who are oppressed. Today Jesus reminds us of the necessity for both in the life of faith.

The Diamond Rule

What the first reading calls aliens are immigrants or newcomers. They lived among the Hebrews, but were not Jews themselves. The Lord reminds the people that they were once aliens themselves. They should not make the same mistake the Egyptians did when they mistreated the Israelites. God uses the same logic in commanding them to take care of widows and orphans. Treat them like family, or else your own wives and children will be in the same situation.

The reason for such compassion should be deeper than just fear of punishment. Jesus said, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:39). He called this the second commandment.



The first is to love God wholly and completely, heart, mind, and soul. If the second commandment is the Golden Rule, the first might be called the Diamond Rule. If you think about it, in order to keep the first commandment, you have to be keeping the second as well.

Jesus said that whatever you do for the poor, the homeless, the sick, or prisoners, you do for him (Matthew 25:31-46). We can't really say we love God if we don't love the people God created.

So that gives us two reasons to love our neighbor. First, because God lives in other people, so loving God means loving God wherever God is found. Second, God loves them, so if we are to be holy, we must be like God. What does that mean? Remember the saying that "charity begins at home?" It doesn't end there. If we truly love God, we will extend our charity to those outside our homes. People are probably still rebuilding after earthquakes, tornadoes, floods, and other disasters, and every city has some kind of homeless shelters. You say you love God? Let's see you love your neighbor. ~Tom Schmidt

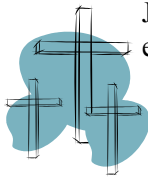
1. Open hand wide, fingers straight

El Amor a Dios

En medio de las vicisitudes de la vida el hombre se pregunta: ¿que da unidad a mi vida? Ante los diversos preceptos a guardar ¿cuál es el más importante? ¿Qué debe ser la base de mi actuar? ¿Qué permanece en el tiempo y las personas?

El evangelio nos da una respuesta: *es amar a Dios con todo el corazón, con toda el alma y con todo el ser*". La razón está en que somos llamados a vivir en unión con Dios.

Existimos por el amor de Dios, que nos creó y conserva. Debemos, amar a Dios con todo el corazón porque Él es bueno, es inmensa su misericordia. Él es el dador de bienes. Él nos creó por amor y nos ha redimido por amor.

El amor a Dios por encima de todas las cosas da estabilidad a nuestra vida y nos libra del pecado. Nos destruimos en la medida que nos alejamos del amor de Dios y construimos nuestros propios ídolos. Así como los israelitas al construir el becerro de oro se alejaron de Dios, así nosotros, al alejarnos de Dios nos sentimos perdidos y desolados..

Jesús afirma que el amor a Dios va unido al amor al prójimo. Como amar a Dios a quien no vemos, y no amar al hermano que está a nuestro lado. Es un engaño pretender amar a Dios y despreocuparnos del hermano. El amor a Dios se enciende al unimos al sufrimiento y las necesidades de los demás.

La primera lectura menciona tres clases de personas que merecen especial caridad: los forasteros, las viudas-huérfanos y los que tienen que recurrir a préstamos para sobrevivir. El pueblo elegido fue forastero en Egipto y sufrió las penas del inmigrante. Las viudas y huérfanos estaban indefensos. El huérfano y desvalido es escuchado por Dios. Si *el afligido invoca al Señor, Él lo escucha y lo libra de sus angustias*.

¿POR QUE CELEBRAMOS LA SANTA MISA?

Como sabemos, la Misa la celebramos por mandato expreso del Señor Jesús, que ha querido quedarse en medio de nosotros que somos su pueblo, en el Sacramento de la Eucaristía.

Con este sacramento, el Señor nos fortalece para que podamos vivir nuestra fe y luchar contra el mal, mientras peregrinamos en este mundo.

San Pablo nos dice porque celebramos la Misa:

“Yo he recibido una tradición que procede del Señor y que a mi vez les transmito.

Que el Señor Jesús, en la noche en que iban a entregarlo, tomó pan y, pronunciando la Acción de Gracias, lo partió y dijo: Este es mi Cuerpo, que se entrega por ustedes. Hagan esto en memoria mía.

Lo mismo hizo con el cáliz, después de cenar, diciendo: Este cáliz es la Nueva Alianza sellada con mi Sangre; hagan esto cada vez que lo beban, en memoria mía.

Por esto, cada vez que comen de este pan y beben de este cáliz, proclaman la muerte del Señor, hasta que vuelva” (1Co 11,22–26)

¿ES CORRECTO DECIR, VOY A OIR MISA?

No, el cristiano no va a oír Misa, sino vamos a participar en la Misa de manera consciente, activa y total. No venimos a Misa a ver y oír, sino, para juntos, como pueblo de Dios, celebrar el sacrificio de Cristo.

Y, ¿COMO PARTICIPAR EN LA MISA? ¿BASTA CON QUE ESTE AHÍ PRESENTE ?

Respondiendo con voz clara y alta, participando en los cantos, para así manifestar el gozo y la alegría que vivimos durante la celebración de la Santa Misa.

En la Santa Misa se cumple las palabras de Jesús: “Donde hay dos o tres reunidos en mi nombre, ahí estoy yo en medio de ellos” (Mt 18, 20).

40 Días por la Vida es una campaña de paz que nos invita a colaborar con el plan de Dios y terminar con el aborto. Esta cruzada está enfocada en el poder de la Oración y el Ayuno para que el aborto no sea sólo ilegal sino impensable. ¿Sabes qué es una herejía?

Una herejía es un rechazo, a plena conciencia, de cualquiera de las verdades que profesamos en el Credo.

Como sabemos, el Credo no es simplemente una oración, sino una profesión, de las cosas en las que los católicos creemos. Por eso se llama “Profesión de Fe”.

Tomemos una de las verdades del Credo. Por ejemplo, **“Creo en la resurrección de los muertos”**.

Si uno rechazara esta verdad, o la pone en duda, cometería una herejía. También si cree en algo diferente y contradictorio a esta verdad, como por ejemplo, en la reencarnación.

Ese puede ser llamado hereje porque estaría creyendo en una falsedad que pretende reemplazar la revelación verdadera que Dios nos ha hecho, a través de su Palabra, acerca de la resurrección en el último día.

Todo Cristiano que cometa una herejía queda excomulgado *ipso facto*, es decir, instantáneamente .
