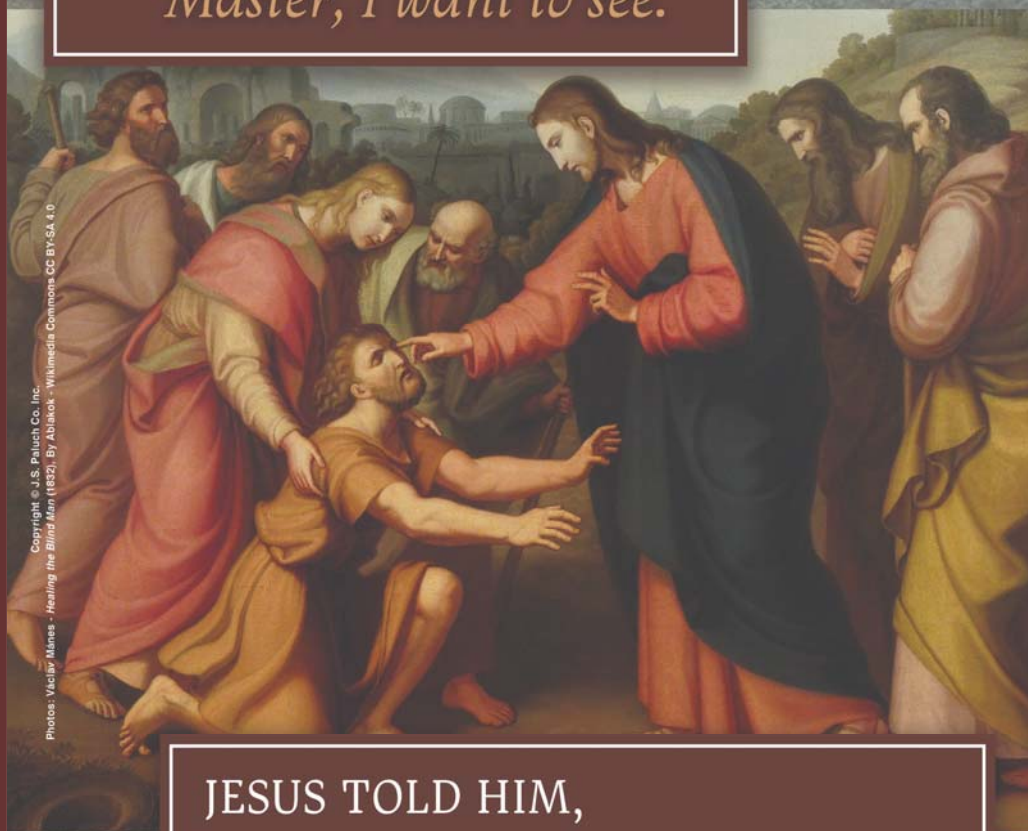

From the Pastor...

My Dear People in Christ,



Our Psalm Response this weekend is, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." So often these days, we only turn to the Lord when we are in trouble or when we need something. When we have a bad day, as all of us do occasionally, we can wallow in negativity, or we can choose to look at the one good thing about that day - the one positive in an otherwise awful day. This seems to be what God was reminding Jeremiah and his people about today in our first reading. The Jewish people had been scattered, they no longer had a place to worship, a place in which God dwelt. They were separated from their families, in a foreign land and had lost much of their freedom. It seems as though it could be pretty gloomy.

But instead of addressing this depression, God points out a few good things and wants them instead to "sing aloud" and "raise shouts". So God makes a few promises here through Jeremiah: He will "lead them back" home again, no matter how far away they are. And not just the healthy and strong ones, but the blind, the lame, the pregnant. He will take care of them all. So think about that when you get depressed!

Similarly, in the Gospel today, we read of Bartimaeus, a blind man, who had every reason to be depressed and miserable. But Bartimaeus had heard word of Jesus and His healings and so he believed Jesus to be the Messiah. Bartimaeus knew what he wanted and he knew who could give it to him, so he shouted all the louder. We might take note of this ourselves when we want something very badly and are not getting it from God. Maybe we have to not give up and, indeed, shout even louder!

When Jesus heard Bartimaeus, He stopped walking and asked for Bartimaeus to be brought to Him. I love the directness of both Jesus and the blind man. They don't waste any time or any words. Both know what they want. Jesus doesn't make small talk; He comes right to the point. "What do you want *Me* to do for you?" He asks. Bartimaeus is just as direct: I want to see again. And Jesus cures him. Just like that! Bartimaeus didn't spend his time depressed because he was blind, but instead took action and concentrated on the positive, that there was a healer.

Let us take time this week to focus on the good things that God has provided in our lives, not on the bad things going on around us. There will always be negatives in our lives - that's what it means to be human, to grow older, to be tempted. Instead, let us look at the good things God has done for us, the good things that present themselves to us each day - like the smile from a neighbor, the help from a store clerk or the sun on our face. They are there if we look for them, and just maybe, it will carry over into our lives and the lives of others, bringing this world even closer to that Kingdom of God, that Jesus preached about.

I wish you all a blessed week ahead.

The Hope and Promise of Redemption

The prophet Jeremiah prophesies the end of the Babylonian exile. He describes how the weak and sorrowful people now return with joy. These are the scattered people of God: the blind and the lame, the mothers and pregnant women. They shall be led along an easy road so that no one will stumble. The Lord's kindness and mercy are on all these weak and broken people.



Here and in Psalm 126 we find the most lovely poetic images of God's love and care for us. "Those that sow in tears / shall reap rejoicing. Although they go forth weeping, / carrying the seed to be sown, / they shall come back rejoicing, / carrying their sheaves" (Psalm 126:5-6). Although God had to punish Israel for their many sins, God never forgot them, scattered as they were, and brings them all back to the land of their ancestors, there to flourish and be joyful again. We can see in this the hope and the promise of our own redemption, gathered from the far corners of the earth into the great banquet of God.

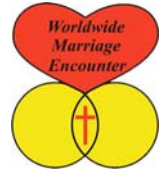

How do I know if I am a registered parishioner?

- 1) Have you completed a green "Parish Registration Card", which is located in the pamphlet holder in the narthex?
- 2) Do you receive envelopes or mailings from St. Francis?

Why is it so important to be registered??

When you are a registered parishioner it will assist us when the time comes for sacramental preparation, such as **couples wishing to be married, parents wishing to have a child baptized, sponsor certificates for sacraments, and special permission letters for baptisms and marriages.**

Also, regular use of envelopes, placed in offertory, even empty, lets us know you are attending Mass regularly, which is a necessity for the things listed above. Contribution statements for monetary donations can only be issued to those parishioners that use envelopes. **Please use your envelope — EMPTY or NOT — whenever you attend Mass.** Place them in the offertory collection so that your attendance may be recorded. **Did you know that only approximately 31% of registered parishioners use their envelopes each week?** Don't forget to use your envelope to make sure that you are counted!! Not sure if you are registered...please call the parish office.

Desde el Escritorio del Párroco



Queridos hermanos en Cristo,

Nuestra respuesta del Salmo este fin de semana es: "El Señor ha hecho grandes cosas por nosotros; estamos llenos de gozo". Muy a menudo en estos días, solo recurrimos al Señor cuando estamos en problemas o cuando necesitamos algo. Cuando tenemos un mal día, como todos lo hacemos de vez en cuando, podemos revolcarnos en la negatividad, o podemos optar por ver lo bueno de ese día: lo único positivo en un día por todo lo malo. Esto parece ser lo que Dios le estaba recordando a Jeremías y su gente sobre el día de hoy en nuestra primera lectura. El pueblo judío se había dispersado, ya no tenían un lugar para adorar, un lugar en el que Dios habitara. Estaban separados de sus familias, en una tierra extranjera y habían perdido gran parte de su libertad. Parecía bastante sombrío.

Pero en lugar de abordar esta depresión, Dios señala algunas cosas buenas y quiere que en lugar de eso "canten en voz alta" y "griten". Así que Dios hace unas promesas aquí a través de Jeremías: Él los "llevará de regreso" a casa otra vez, sin importar cuán lejos estén. Y no solo los sanos y fuertes, sino los ciegos, los cojos, las embarazadas. Él se hará cargo de todos ellos. Así que piensa en eso cuando estés deprimido.

Del mismo modo, en el Evangelio de hoy, leemos de Bartimeo, un ciego, que tenía todas las razones para estar deprimido y miserable. Pero Bartimeo había oído la palabra de Jesús y su sanidad, por lo que creía que Jesús era el Mesías. Bartimeo sabía lo que quería y sabía quién podía dárselo, así que gritó aún más fuerte. Podemos tomar nota de esto nosotros mismos cuando deseamos algo con todo el corazón y no lo estamos obteniendo de Dios. ¡Tal vez no debemos rendirnos y, de hecho, deberíamos de gritar aún más fuerte!

Cuando Jesús escuchó a Bartimeo, dejó de caminar y pidió que se lo llevaran a él. Amo la franqueza tanto de Jesús como del ciego. No pierden tiempo ni palabras. Ambos saben lo que quieren. Jesús no hace una pequeña charla; Él viene directo al punto. "¿Qué quieres que haga por ti?", Pregunta. Bartimeo es igual de directo: quiero ver de nuevo. Y Jesús lo cura. ¡Así! Bartimeo no pasó su tiempo deprimido porque estaba ciego, sino que tomó medidas y se concentró en lo positivo, que había un sanador.

Tomemos tiempo esta semana para enfocarnos en las cosas buenas que Dios ha provisto en nuestras vidas, no en las cosas malas que nos rodean. Siempre habrá aspectos negativos en nuestras vidas: eso es lo que significa ser humano, envejecer, ser tentado. En cambio, observemos las cosas buenas que Dios ha hecho por nosotros, las cosas buenas que se nos presentan cada día, como la sonrisa de un vecino, la ayuda de un empleado de una tienda o el sol en nuestra cara. Todo eso está allí si los buscamos, y tal vez, se trasladen a nuestras vidas y las de los demás, acercando este mundo aún más a ese Reino de Dios, sobre el cual Jesús predicó.

Escuchamos de personas que lo perdieron todo y no paran de llorar. La carta a los hebreos nos recuerda que incluso aquellas personas en una posición con tan alto honor, como el sacerdote, están afectadas por la debilidad. La debilidad está al centro mismo de la habilidad del sacerdote para servir a los demás. Por último, es un hombre ciego al que Jesús ve, gritando a la orilla del camino, quien además de ser reprendido tratan de callarlo quienes lo rodean. A causa de su fe vuelve a ver y su primera decisión como una persona que puede ver es seguir a Jesús. La enseñanza de las lecturas de hoy es que Dios se enfoca en quienes están en las periferias, en los forasteros, en aquellas personas a quien muy frecuentemente tratamos de callar. Dios se enfoca en esas partes de nosotros, nuestras debilidades que intentamos esconder al voltear nuestra atención a cualquier otra cosa. Las lecturas son todo menos lo que es perfecto. Ellos hablan acerca de debilidades, dolor profundo, rupturas que son una parte de nuestra humanidad y una fortaleza enraizada en el amor de Dios por nosotros pese a todo eso.
