From the Pastor...

My Dear People in Christ,

In this week's first reading and gospel, Mother Church offers us reflections on the virtues of hospitality and generosity. Through the examples of two widows, we are led to think of our own behavior. Although destitute and vulnerable, they are still able to give themselves totally and with full faith in God's providence. So, how generous are we?

The widows remind us of a fundamental reality, that is, "Even in our poverty and oppression, we are joyfully in the Hands of our loving God." We continue to entrust ourselves to God, Who will never abandon or forsake us.

In our first reading today, we have an example of hospitality that is hard for us to imagine. The woman was honest with Elijah - what else could she be? She explained that they were very poor, with only meager means. What kind of a woman would take care of a stranger over feeding her own child? It has to be a woman who loves her neighbor as her herself. It is a woman who trusts that God will somehow provide. It is a woman not controlled by fear.

I think that fear stops many of us today from being hospitable. In a culture where there are people who lock their doors even when they take out their garbage, and a culture where we think everyone is after something, we cannot be hospitable. A Church Father, the Blessed Bede, commented in the 7th century that "God cannot be loved apart from our neighbor, nor our neighbor apart from God."

Both widows gave, mindless of themselves and their needs, and in so doing showed their great love for God, their great trust in God. And they did it expecting no rewards.

Do we have the kind of trust in God that would allow us to act despite our fears, outside of our comfort zones and really help someone else? Everyone has something to contribute to God and to society. Because we are not as blessed as some are with great intelligence, great riches, great talents, we tend to sit back today and let those people run things. We can take great lessons from the generous hospitality of the two widows, who in doing what they could do, who in trusting God to the fullest, found great praise in God's eyes. These widows show us how we can be hospitable and not let fear stop us from doing good.

So let us ask ourselves... are we taking care of the needy? Who are we feeding? How are we making people's lives better? When people come in contact with us and our community, are their lives being made better?

I wish you and your family a blessed week ahead.

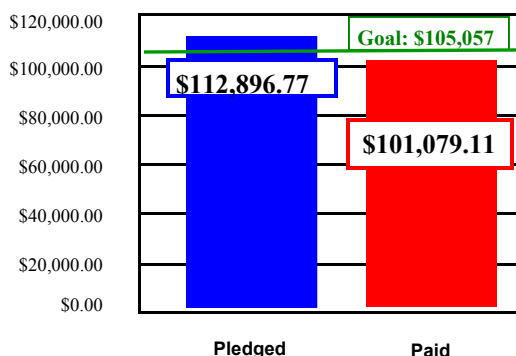

Desde el Escritorio del Párroco



Querido hermanos en Cristo,

En la primera lectura y el evangelio de esta semana, la Madre Iglesia nos ofrece reflexiones sobre las virtudes de la hospitalidad y la generosidad. A través de los ejemplos de dos viudas, nos llevan a pensar en nuestro propio comportamiento. Aunque son indigentes y vulnerables, todavía pueden entregarse totalmente y con plena fe a la providencia de Dios. Entonces, ¿qué tan generosos somos?

Las viudas nos recuerdan una realidad fundamental, es decir, "Incluso en nuestra pobreza y opresión, estamos alegremente en las manos de nuestro Dios amoroso". Seguimos confiándonos a Dios, quien nunca nos dejara ni nos abandonará.

En la primera lectura de hoy, tenemos un ejemplo de hospitalidad que nos resulta difícil imaginar. La mujer fue honesta con Elías, ¿qué otra cosa podría ser? Explicó que eran muy pobres, con escasos recursos. ¿Qué clase de mujer cuidaría a un extraño en vez de alimentar a su propio hijo? Tiene que ser una mujer que ama a su vecina como a ella misma. Es una mujer que confía en que Dios proveerá de alguna manera. Es una mujer que no se deja controlar por el miedo.

Creo que el miedo nos impide a muchos de nosotros ser hospitalarios. En una cultura donde hay personas que cierran sus puertas incluso cuando sacan su basura, y una cultura donde creemos que todos buscan algo, no podemos ser hospitalarios. Un Padre de la Iglesia, el beato Bede, comentó en el siglo séptimo que "Dios no puede ser amado sin nuestro prójimo, ni nuestro prójimo sin Dios". Ambas viudas dieron, sin pensar en sí mismas y en sus necesidades, y al hacerlo demostraron su gran amor por Dios, su gran confianza en Dios. Y lo hicieron sin esperar recompensas.

¿Tenemos el tipo de confianza en Dios que nos permitiría actuar a pesar de nuestros temores, fuera de nuestras zonas de comodidad y realmente ayudar a alguien más? Todos tenemos algo que aportar a Dios y a la sociedad. Debido a que no estamos tan bendecidos como algunos con gran inteligencia, grandes riquezas, grandes talentos, tendemos a sentarnos hoy y dejar que otras personas manejen las cosas. Podemos tomar grandes lecciones de la generosa hospitalidad de las dos viudas, quienes al hacer lo que podían hacer, quienes al confiar en Dios al máximo, encontraron grandes alabanzas a los ojos de Dios. Estas viudas nos muestran cómo podemos ser hospitalarios y no dejar que el miedo nos impida hacer el bien.

Así que preguntémosnos... ¿estamos cuidando a los necesitados? ¿A quién estamos alimentando? ¿Cómo estamos mejorando la vida de las personas? Cuando las personas entran en contacto con nosotros y con nuestra comunidad, ¿están mejorando sus vidas?
