

## From the Pastor...

My Dear People in Christ,

In our Gospel reading, Pilate addresses Jesus, asking, "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus answered that question with dignity, in spite of being bound and exhausted. It was the dignity of a true king, which is what He was and continues to be. He said, "My kingdom is not of this world." At that moment, when He was standing before Pilate, Our Lord did not show His power and glory... but at the end of time, He will do so. He will come in majesty and in triumph. He will come as the King of All the Universe, openly showing His power. Those who are evil in this world will not be able to eclipse the glorious return of Christ the King.

Jesus made Pilate see that He did not come to this world to display His power in human terms. Rather, He came to restore the human race to the natural dignity that it lost when Adam and Eve committed the original sin. He came to remind us that we are sons and daughters of God the Father.

In 1925, when the atheism of the Nazis and communists surged forth and threatened the Christian world, the Church decided to fight against those ideologies by emphasizing the sovereignty of Jesus Christ and His final triumph over evil and injustice. Since that crucial moment in the history of the world, the Church has closed each liturgical year with this great feast dedicated to Christ the King.

Jesus Christ has always been a sign of contradiction, as much today as when he came to earth more than two thousand years ago. There are those who ignore Him or even hate Him. And there are those who love Him unconditionally. There are those who only go to Him when they have problems because they think that He will resolve them. And there are those who love Him and who follow Him, despite their problems, without asking for anything or blaming Him for anything, giving of themselves to Him. There are those who show that they always have Christ in their hearts and in their minds. They always talk to everyone about Him. And there are those who say they are Christians, they even think they are good Christians, but they are Christians in name only. They never talk about Jesus. They not only do not talk about Him, they do not follow Him.

Profoundly living Christian lives every day should be the goal of every good Christian. We cannot be Christians just some of the time. Christians who truly follow Christ should make an effort to make holiness a part of their lives. They should show through their lives the peace, love and justice that only the Lord can give them.

We should not forget that He has promised that His Kingdom will be triumphant. This is our hope, and it is what we, and the Church, celebrate on this great feast.

Long live Christ the King!

En ese momento, cuando estaba frente a Pilato, Nuestro Señor no mostró Su poder y gloria ... pero al final de los tiempos, lo hará. Él vendrá en majestad y en triunfo. Él vendrá como el Rey de Todo el Universo, mostrando abiertamente su poder. Los que son malos en este mundo no podrán eclipsar el glorioso regreso de Cristo Rey.

Jesús hizo que Pilato viera que no vino a este mundo para mostrar su poder en términos humanos. Más bien, vino para restaurar la raza humana a la dignidad natural que perdió cuando Adán y Eva cometieron el pecado original. Él vino para recordarnos que somos hijos e hijas de Dios Padre.

Y hay quienes lo aman incondicionalmente. Hay quienes solo acuden a Él cuando tienen problemas porque piensan que Él los resolverá. Y hay quienes lo aman y lo siguen, a pesar de sus problemas, sin pedir nada ni culparlo por nada, entregándose a él. Hay quienes demuestran que siempre tienen a Cristo en sus corazones y en sus mentes. Siempre hablan a todos acerca de él. Y hay quienes dicen que son cristianos, incluso piensan que son buenos cristianos, pero solo son cristianos de nombre. Nunca hablan de Jesús. No solo no hablan de Él, sino que no lo siguen.

Las vidas cristianas que viven profundamente todos los días deben ser la meta de todo buen cristiano. No podemos ser cristianos solo parte del tiempo. Los cristianos que verdaderamente seguimos a Cristo debemos hacer un esfuerzo para hacer que la santidad sea parte de nuestras vidas. Debemos mostrar a través de nuestras vidas la paz, el amor y la justicia que solo el Señor puede darnos.

No debemos olvidar que Él ha prometido que Su Reino triunfará. Esta es nuestra esperanza, y es lo que nosotros, y la Iglesia, celebramos en esta gran fiesta.

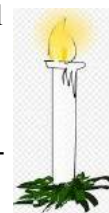
Salmo -- Protégeme, Dios mío, que me refugio en ti (Salmo 16 [15]).
