From the Pastor...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one; I died, and behold I am alive for evermore” (Rev 1:17-18). We read these comforting words in the Book of Revelation. They invite us to turn our gaze to Christ, to experience His reassuring presence. To each person, whatever his condition, even if it were the most complicated and dramatic, the Risen One repeats: “Fear not! I died on the Cross but now I am alive for evermore”; “I am the first and the last, and the living one.”

“The first,” that is, the source of every being and the first-fruits of the new creation; “the last,” the definitive end of history; “the living one,” the inexhaustible source of life that triumphed over death forever.

In the Messiah, crucified and risen, we recognize the features of the Lamb sacrificed on Golgotha, Who implores forgiveness for His torturers and opens the gates of heaven to repentant sinners; we glimpse the face of the Immortal King, Who now has “the keys of Death and Hades” (Rev 1:18).

The Gospel, which has just been proclaimed, helps us to grasp the full sense and value of this gift. The Evangelist, John, makes us share in the emotion felt by the Apostles in their meeting with Christ after His Resurrection. Our attention focuses on the gesture of the Master, Who transmits to the fearful, astounded disciples the mission of being ministers of Divine Mercy. He shows them His hands and His side, which bear the marks of the Passion, and tells them: **“As the Father has sent Me, even so I send you.” (Jn 20:21).**

Immediately afterwards, He breathed on them, and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.” (Jn. 20:22-23). Jesus entrusted to them the gift of “forgiving sins,” a gift that flows from the wounds in His hands, His feet, and especially from His pierced side. From there a font of mercy is poured out over all humanity.

His “Sacred Heart” has given men everything: redemption, salvation, sanctification. The two rays, according to what Jesus, Himself, told to Sr. Faustina, denote blood and water. (Diary, 299). The blood recalls the sacrifice of Golgotha and the mystery of the Eucharist; the water, according to the rich symbolism of the Evangelist John, makes us think of Baptism and the Gift of the Holy Spirit. (Jn 3:5; 4:14).

Through the mystery of this wounded Heart, the restorative tide of God’s merciful love continues to spread over the men and women of our time.

“Jesus, I trust in You!” This prayer clearly expresses the attitude with which we too, would like to abandon ourselves trustfully in Your hands, Oh Lord, our only Savior.

Let us thank the Lord for His love, which is stronger than death and sin. It is revealed and put into practice as mercy in our daily lives, and prompts every person in turn to have “mercy” towards the Crucified One.
I wish you a happy and blessed week ahead.

Homily on Divine Mercy

Benediction and Final Blessing

On February 22, 1931, a young Polish nun, Sr. Faustina Kowalski, saw a vision of Jesus with rays of mercy streaming from the area of **His** Heart. **He** told her to have an image painted to represent this vision and to sign it, “**Jesus, I Trust in You!**”

Calling her the Apostle and Secretary of **His** mercy, **He** ordered her to begin writing a diary so others would learn to trust in **Him**. In a series of revelations, **He** taught her that **His** mercy is unlimited and available even to the greatest sinners and **He** revealed special ways for people to respond to **His** mercy.

The Feast of Divine Mercy — Jesus requested that the Sunday following Easter be officially established as the **Feast of Divine Mercy** and **He** told Faustina, “**On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open to those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy.**”

The Image of Divine Mercy — Jesus said, “**By means of this image, I shall be granting many graces to souls, so let every soul have access to it. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image shall not perish..because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works.**”

The Divine Mercy Chaplet — Our Lord taught Sr. Faustina a special prayer for mercy: “**Encourage souls to say the Chaplet....whoever will recite it will receive great mercy...At the hour of their death, I defend as My own glory every soul that will say this chaplet, or when others say it for a dying person, the indulgence is the same.**”

The Hour of Great Mercy — Our Lord asked for special prayer at the hour that recalls **His** death “**At three o’clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners: and; if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion.....In this hour I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes**

Desde el Escritorio del Párroco

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:



“No temas, yo soy el primero y el último, y el que vive; morí, y he aquí que estoy vivo para siempre” (Apocalipsis 1: 17-18). Leemos estas palabras reconfortantes en el libro de Apocalipsis. Nos invitan a volver nuestra mirada a Cristo, a experimentar su presencia tranquilizadora. Para cada persona, independientemente de su condición, incluso si fuera la más complicada y dramática, el Resucitado repite: “¡No teman! Morí en la Cruz, pero ahora estoy vivo para siempre”; “Yo soy el primero y el último, y el que vive.”

“El primero”, es decir, la fuente de cada ser y los primeros frutos de la nueva creación; “el último”, el fin definitivo de la historia; “el que vive”, la fuente inagotable de la vida que triunfó sobre la muerte para siempre.

En el Mesías, crucificado y resucitado, reconocemos las características del Cordero sacrificado en Gólgota, quien implora perdón por Sus torturadores y abre las puertas del cielo a los pecadores arrepentidos; vislumbramos el rostro del Rey Inmortal, que ahora tiene “las llaves de la Muerte y el Hades” (Ap. 1:18).

El Evangelio, que se acaba de proclamar, nos ayuda a captar el pleno sentido y el valor de este regalo. El evangelista, Juan, nos hace compartir la emoción que sienten los apóstoles en su encuentro con Cristo después de su resurrección. Nuestra atención se centra en el gesto del Maestro, que transmite a los temerosos y asombrados discípulos la misión de ser ministros de la Divina Misericordia. Él les muestra Sus manos y Su costado, que llevan las marcas de la Pasión, y les dice: “Como el Padre me envió, también yo os envió” (Jn 20, 21).

Inmediatamente después, “sopló sobre ellos y les dijo: “Reciban el Espíritu Santo. Si perdonáis los pecados de alguno, serán perdonados; si retienes los pecados de cualquiera, se les retendrán” (Jn. 20: 22-23). (Jn 3: 5; 4:14).
