From the Pastor...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

All three of today's readings revolve around the direction of the early church to include the Gentiles, the non-Jews, into the growing Christian movement. In a way, this is like studying a history, the importance of which doesn't impact us too much today...we take it for granted. But for the early church it was major!

Jesus was a Jew. He was a Jew when He was born and when He died. He taught in synagogues and followed the Mosaic Law. In Jewish terms, He could and would have been considered a prophet. But due to the Passion and Resurrection, His followers were given a much deeper insight into Him, and Jesus became much more than just a prophet. The concept of "Christian" was not formed until after His Resurrection.

In these short yet beautiful lines from the Gospel of John, we hear Jesus, the Good Shepherd, promise that we will hear His Voice, follow Him and be granted eternal life. The image of the shepherd, while not so familiar to city dwellers today, was certainly a very apt and familiar image in Jesus' time. In our time, it has even taken on a more negative image - the idea that we are sheep, followers, who can't make up our own minds.

We, as Americans, like to be self-reliant. But this is in no way the image that is meant in these readings. It is a 'protective' image of a shepherd, who knows better than his sheep where food and water and housing are, and whose prime duty is to take care of the sheep and make sure that they are taken care of and are not left for wolves to snatch and kill. This was a matter of honor in the Mediterranean Society of Jesus' time. Protecting his sheep involved a shepherd's honor and he would protect that honor to the death, without complaint. This is one of those readings that is difficult for us to understand through the lens of our American culture, and so it is important that we recognize the differences in our culture and the culture of Jesus' time to really understand the beautiful metaphor Jesus was using.

What we should take from this reading today, besides the cultural understanding, is that we need to listen to Jesus' Voice if we are to receive the protection and care and love of Jesus. To hear and to respond to Jesus' words is the key to today's readings and to living a good life. Do we take the time to listen to God's Word in the written Word we read on Sundays and in our Bibles, and do we listen to the Word inside us?

Let us remember, each week when we take Jesus inside us in the Eucharist, that our greatest protection and shepherding comes from within. Take the time to listen to Jesus. Spend some quality time this week with Jesus. Just a few minutes to listen quietly or reflect on His words can change your day. This is how we are nourished. And it is how we can be judged.

Desde el Escritorio del Párroco

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo!



Las tres lecturas de hoy giran en torno a la dirección de la iglesia primitiva para incluir a los gentiles, los no judíos, en el creciente movimiento cristiano. En cierto modo, esto es como estudiar una historia, cuya importancia no nos afecta demasiado hoy... lo damos por hecho. ¡Pero para la iglesia primitiva era importante!

Jesús era judío. Él era un judío cuando nació y cuando murió. Enseñó en sinagogas y siguió la ley mosaica. En términos judíos, Él podría y habría sido considerado un profeta. Pero debido a la Pasión y la Resurrección, a sus seguidores se les dió una visión mucho más profunda de Él, y Jesús se convirtió en mucho más que un simple profeta. El concepto de "cristiano" no se formó hasta después de su resurrección.

En estas líneas cortas pero hermosas del Evangelio de Juan, escuchamos a Jesús, el Buen Pastor, prometemos que escucharemos Su Voz, lo seguiremos y se nos otorgará vida eterna. La imagen del buen pastor, aunque hoy no es tan familiar para los habitantes de las ciudades, fue ciertamente una imagen muy apropiada y familiar en el tiempo de Jesús. En nuestro tiempo, incluso ha tomado una imagen más negativa: la idea de que somos ovejas, seguidores, que no podemos decidirnos.

A nosotros, como estadounidenses, nos gusta ser autosuficientes. Pero esto no es de ninguna manera la imagen que se pretende en estas lecturas. Es una imagen 'protectora' de un pastor, que sabe mejor que sus ovejas dónde se encuentran la comida, el agua y la vivienda, y cuyo principal deber es cuidar a las ovejas y asegurarse de que se cuiden y no se dejen. Este fue un asunto de honor en la sociedad mediterránea de la época de Jesús. La protección de sus ovejas involucraba el honor de un pastor y él protegería ese honor hasta la muerte, sin quejarse. Esta es una de esas lecturas que nos resulta difícil entender a través del lente de nuestra cultura estadounidense, por lo que es importante que reconozcamos las diferencias en nuestra cultura y la cultura de la época de Jesús para entender realmente la hermosa metáfora que Jesús estaba usando.

Lo que debemos sacar de esta lectura de hoy, además de la comprensión cultural, es que debemos escuchar la Voz de Jesús si queremos recibir la protección, el cuidado y el amor de Jesús. Escuchar y responder a las palabras de Jesús es la clave para las lecturas de hoy y para vivir una buena vida. ¿Nos tomamos el tiempo para escuchar la Palabra de Dios en la Palabra escrita que leemos los domingos y en nuestras Biblias, y escuchamos la Palabra dentro de nosotros?

Recordemos, cada semana cuando llevamos a Jesús dentro de nosotros en la Eucaristía, que nuestra mayor protección y pastoreo viene de dentro. Tómame el tiempo para escuchar a Jesús. Pasa un tiempo de calidad esta semana con Jesús. Solo unos minutos para escuchar en silencio o reflexionar sobre Sus palabras puede cambiar tu día. Así es como estamos nutridos. Y así es como podemos ser juzgados.
