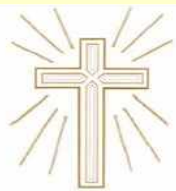

From the Pastor...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As always, we begin the new Liturgical Year with Advent, a term that comes from the Latin “adventus, meaning “a coming”. And so, we begin preparations for a ‘coming’ event which, of course, has already come, but which ‘comes’ again each year in celebration, so that the Incarnation can constantly be made new in our hearts.

So, how do we begin? We begin by going up to the House of the Lord. This theme, expressed both in Isaiah and the Psalm, sets up our journey of the next four weeks. Like the ‘coming attraction’ of a new movie, the themes of Advent and Christmas are flashed before us - the establishment of the Lord’s House; the coming of all the nations, the word of the Lord being given to us, peace instead of war, and mostly the image of “light” coming into the world. Both the Psalm and the first reading are filled with these quick images.

Even though this is the first week of the Church Year, our gospel is taken from the 24th chapter of Matthew, which speaks of Christ’s Second Coming and not the Nativity, for which we prepare in Advent. This particular reading invites us to explore the similarities between the First and Second Coming.

During Advent, we prepare for the joy of Christ’s birth, even knowing that Jesus still had to do the work and die for us. He has accomplished that, and we have already been saved. His second Coming also needs preparation, and we can learn from our preparation in Advent, that the same things are required of us throughout life in awaiting Jesus’ coming again.

We recall that the early Christians thought that the coming was going to be very soon. When this Gospel was written, many felt that it could be any day - and they were right - it could be any day, and it still could be.

The message to go out to all the world and spread the Good News that Christ came for all, is one of the continuing messages of the Gospels. I would like you to begin to think about how your life might be a preview or ‘coming attraction’ for another person to see. When someone observes your life, sees you in action and in contemplation, do they see you wearing Christ? This is the first step in evangelization - living our faith so that all nations can recognize it.

I would also like to suggest that an Advent Calendar is a great way to keep focused on the progression of Advent and arrival of Christmas. It is not just for kids, but for all of us, so that we can better greet each day with renewed fervor for self-purification and renewal in preparation for the King. We must try to find something that will help us to keep this in mind.

I wish you and your families a happy and blessed Advent Season.

Desde el Escritorio del Párroco

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo!



Como siempre, comenzamos el nuevo año litúrgico con el Adviento, un término que proviene del latín "adventus", que significa "una venida". Y así, comenzamos los preparativos para un evento de "venida" que, por supuesto, ya ha llegado, pero que "viene" nuevamente cada año en celebración, para que la Encarnación se pueda renovar constantemente en nuestros corazones.

Entonces, ¿cómo comenzamos? Comenzamos subiendo a la Casa del Señor. Este tema, expresado tanto en Isaías como en el Salmo, establece nuestro viaje de las próximas cuatro semanas. Al igual que la "próxima atracción" de una nueva película, los temas de Adviento y Navidad se presentan ante nosotros: el establecimiento de la Casa del Señor; la venida de todas las naciones, la palabra del Señor que nos fue dada, la paz en lugar de la guerra, y sobre todo la imagen de "luz" que viene al mundo. Tanto el Salmo como la primera lectura están llenos de estas imágenes rápidas.

Aunque esta es la primera semana del Año de la Iglesia, nuestro evangelio está tomado del capítulo 24 de Mateo, que habla de la Segunda Venida de Cristo y no de la Natividad, para lo cual nos preparamos en el Adviento. Esta lectura particular nos invita a explorar las similitudes entre la Primera y la Segunda Venida.

Durante el Adviento, nos preparamos para la alegría del nacimiento de Cristo, aun sabiendo que Jesús todavía tenía que hacer el trabajo y morir por nosotros. Él lo ha logrado, y ya hemos sido salvados. Su segunda venida también necesita preparación, y podemos aprender de nuestra preparación en Adviento, que se requieren las mismas cosas de nosotros a lo largo de la vida a la espera de la venida de Jesús.

Recordamos que los primeros cristianos pensaban que la venida sería muy pronto. Cuando se escribió este Evangelio, muchos sintieron que podría ser cualquier día, y tenían razón, podría ser cualquier día, y aún podría ser.

El mensaje para salir a todo el mundo y difundir la Buena Nueva de que Cristo vino para todos, es uno de los mensajes continuos de los Evangelios. Me gustaría que comenzáramos a pensar en cómo nuestra vida podría ser una vista previa o una "próxima atracción" para que otra persona la vea. Cuando alguien observa nuestra vida, nos ven en acción y en contemplación, ¿nos ven usando a Cristo? Este es el primer paso en la evangelización: vivir nuestra fe para que todas las naciones puedan reconocerla.

También me gustaría sugerir que un Calendario de Adviento es una excelente manera de mantenerse enfocado en la progresión del Adviento y la llegada de la Navidad. No es solo para niños, sino para todos nosotros, de modo que podamos saludar mejor cada día con fervor renovado para la auto-purificación y la renovación en preparación para el Rey. Debemos tratar de encontrar algo que nos ayude a tener esto en cuenta.

Les deseo una feliz y bendecida temporada de Adviento.

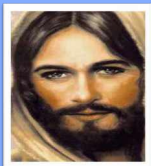
