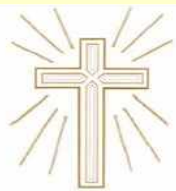

From the Pastor...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



In this second week of Advent, I would like to concentrate my reflection on today's first reading, which is taken from the book of the prophet, Isaiah. The prophet says, "The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them. (Isaiah 11:6)". What does that mean?

Observing the human community and their relationships, one gets the impression that there are two kinds of people, the oppressors and the oppressed. The dividing line between the two groups runs through gender, ethnicity and race, social class and religious affiliation. Invariably, one group appears to be the wolf and the other the lamb. Isaiah is aware of this state of affairs among humans. He speaks of the human community in terms of wolves and lambs, leopards and kids, lions and calves, bears and cows. He sees that the wolf eats the lamb; the lion eats the calf and the bear the cow. Isaiah's interest, however, is not simply in the way things are or have always been but in the way things can be. Isaiah is a man of vision. And here, he recounts his vision of the day of the Lord... "the days to come", when God will manifest His glory to all humankind.

"Impossible," some people will say upon reading this. "He is dreaming. The wolf can never live in peace with the lamb because it is in the nature of the wolf to eat the lamb." But that is exactly the point. We need a completely new heart. This radical transformation of human nature is possible only by God's grace.

God's grace transforms human nature so radically that one needs to experience it to believe it. Grace working in nature accomplishes so much more than we could ever imagine. It is only, when transformed by grace, that the wolf can live in peace with the lamb. Only then can the ferocious animals learn to accept their weaker neighbors as equals who have an equal right to life and well-being.

Note that Isaiah is not talking of merely "tolerating" or "putting up with" the other. The peace of this new world order is not just an absence of war or friction. No! It is the peace based on justice and the mutual recognition that everyone has the right, not only to life but to the good life.

In our personal and business life, do we consciously or unconsciously operate on the principle that for us to win someone else has to lose? The vision of the new world order to which the prophets invite us today is founded on the principle that we can all be winners. The full story of the Wolf and the Lamb, as Isaiah relates it to us today, will end with "and they lived happily ever after."

We pray for the coming of this new world order...the Kingdom of God. And this is exactly the Kingdom of God that St. John the Baptist introduces in our Gospel today.

I wish you all a Blessed Advent.

Isaiah says: "The earth shall be filled with knowledge of the Lord." Who taught you knowledge of the Lord, and whom are you teaching today?

Desde el Escritorio del Párroco

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo!



En esta segunda semana de Adviento, me gustaría concentrar mi reflexión en la primera lectura de hoy, que está tomada del libro del profeta Isaías. El profeta dice: “El lobo vivirá con el cordero, el leopardo se acostará con el niño juntos, y un niño pequeño los guiará”. (Isaías 11: 6) Qué significa eso?

Observando la raza humana y sus relaciones, uno tiene la impresión de que hay dos tipos de personas, los opresores y los oprimidos. La línea divisoria entre los dos grupos abarca el género, el origen étnico y la raza, la clase social y la afiliación religiosa. Invariablemente, un grupo parece ser el lobo y el otro el cordero. Isaías es consciente de este estado de cosas entre los humanos. Habla de la comunidad humana en términos de lobos y corderos, leopardos y niños, leones y terneros, osos y vacas. Él ve que el lobo se come al cordero; el león muerde la pantorrilla y el oso a la vaca. Sin embargo, el interés de Isaías no está simplemente en cómo son o siempre han sido las cosas, sino en cómo podrían ser las cosas. Isaías es un hombre de visión. Y aquí, él relata su visión del día del Señor ... “los días por venir”, cuando Dios manifestará su gloria a toda la humanidad.

“Imposible”, dirán algunas personas al leer esto. “Él está soñando. El lobo nunca puede vivir en paz con el cordero porque está en la naturaleza del lobo comerse al cordero”. Pero ese es el punto. Necesitamos un corazón completamente nuevo. Esta transformación radical de la naturaleza humana solo es posible por la gracia de Dios.

La gracia de Dios transforma la naturaleza humana tan radicalmente que uno tiene que experimentar para creer. La gracia que trabaja en la naturaleza logra mucho más de lo que podríamos imaginar. Solo cuando se transforma por gracia, el lobo puede vivir en paz con el cordero. Solo entonces los animales feroces pueden aprender a aceptar a sus vecinos más débiles como iguales que tienen el mismo derecho a la vida y al bienestar.

Tengamos en cuenta que Isaías no está hablando de simplemente “tolerar” o ser pacientes con el otro. La paz de este nuevo orden mundial no es solo una ausencia de guerra o fricción. ¡No! Es la paz basada en la justicia y el reconocimiento mutuo de que todos tenemos derecho, no solo a la vida sino a una buena vida.

En nuestra vida personal y comercial, ¿operamos consciente o inconscientemente con el principio de que para ganar, alguien más tiene que perder? La visión del nuevo orden mundial al que los profetas nos invitan hoy se basa en el principio de que todos podemos ser ganadores. La historia completa del Lobo y el Cordero, como Isaías nos la relata hoy, terminará con “y vivieron felices para siempre”.

Oramos por la llegada de este nuevo orden mundial ... el Reino de Dios. Y este es exactamente el Reino de Dios que San Juan Bautista introduce hoy en nuestro Evangelio.

Les deseo a todos una bendecida temporada de Adviento.
