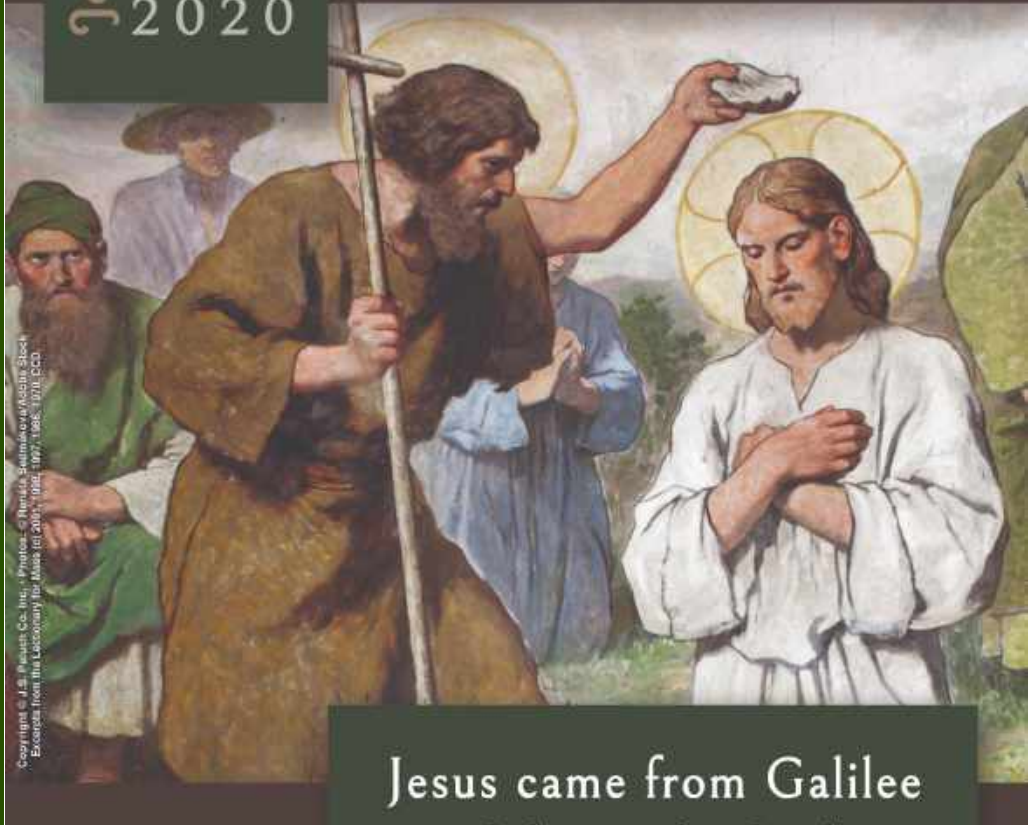

From the Pastor...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



What does baptism mean?

The meaning of baptism can be found in four words: Rebirth, Initiation, Consecration, and Empowerment. In baptism, we are born again by water and the Holy Spirit. We are cleansed from original sin and become sons and daughters of God in a special way. At baptism, we are initiated or admitted into full membership of the church, the community of the children of God in the world. In baptism, we consecrate and dedicate ourselves to seek and to spread the Kingdom of God. We commit ourselves to be servants of God, to do God's Will and serve God with our whole lives.

Looking at the baptism of Jesus, by John in the Jordan, we find that Jesus did not need a rebirth since He was from all eternity, the Only Begotten Child of God. He had no original sin from which to be cleansed.

Did Jesus need initiation? Yes. Being human, Jesus needed to associate and to identify with the community of men and women who were dedicated to promoting the cause of the Kingdom of God. We need to interact with other children of God. We need the community of faith just as Jesus did. We need the church.

What about empowerment? The Holy Spirit, the Power of the Most High, Who descended on Jesus at His baptism, strengthened and empowered Him. It was at His baptism that "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; [and] He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil" (Acts 10:37-38). Baptism for Jesus was a moment of self-consecration, a moment of self-dedication. For Him, it was a commitment to do whatever was necessary to promote the cause of the Kingdom of God on earth.

Jesus' baptism reminds us of our mission: to experience the presence of God within us, to acknowledge our own dignity as God's children, and to appreciate the Divine Presence in others by honoring them, loving them and serving them in all humility. This is also a day for us to renew our Baptismal promises, consecrating ourselves to the Holy Trinity, and "rejecting Satan and all his empty promises", which our profane world is constantly offering us through its mass-media communication.

What are we doing, each one of us, to promote the Kingdom of God? Are we ready to consecrate and dedicate ourselves wholly to the service of this Kingdom just as Jesus did? If not, what are we doing to support those who have consecrated themselves to doing this work in the name of us all?

Let us today, with Jesus, renew our baptismal commitment to bear witness to the Good News of the Kingdom of God in word and in deed.

I wish you all a happy, blessed week ahead.

**Today's Readings**

First Reading — Isaiah speaks of the Servant whom the LORD upholds; he shall bring forth justice to the nations (Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7).

Psalm — The Lord will bless his people with peace (Psalm 29).

Second Reading — Jesus was anointed by God with the Holy Spirit; he went out healing and doing good (Acts 10:34-38).

Gospel — A voice comes from heaven proclaiming Jesus as the beloved Son, with whom God is well pleased (Matthew 3:13-17).

This is my Beloved Son

This Sunday's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord closes the Christmas season. In the scriptures we see one more epiphany, or manifestation, of the Spirit of God in Jesus—but this time it is as an adult, rather than as a child. Jesus' baptism also serves as the inauguration of his prophetic mission and the messianic age.



Today's reading from Isaiah describes God's chosen Messiah, upon whom God's spirit rests. In the Acts of the Apostles Peter says that "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power" (Acts 10:38). Finally, in the proclamation from Matthew's Gospel Jesus' baptism in water goes almost unnoticed. The crucial moment comes when the Spirit of God comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven echoes the words of Isaiah: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17).

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo!

¿Qué significa bautismo?



El significado del bautismo se puede encontrar en cuatro palabras: renacimiento, iniciación, consagración y llenarse de fuerzas. En el bautismo, nacemos de nuevo por el agua y el Espíritu Santo. Somos limpiados del pecado original y nos convertimos en hijos e hijas de Dios de una manera muy especial. En el bautismo, somos iniciados o admitidos como miembros de la iglesia, la comunidad de los hijos de Dios en el mundo. En el bautismo, nos consagramos y nos dedicamos a buscar y difundir el Reino de Dios. Nos comprometemos a ser servidores de Dios, a hacer la voluntad de Dios y servir a Dios toda nuestra vida.

Mirando el bautismo de Jesús, por Juan en el Jordán, encontramos que Jesús no necesitaba un renacimiento ya que Él era de toda la eternidad, el Hijo Unigénito de Dios. No tenía pecado original del cual ser limpiado.

¿Necesitaba Jesús iniciación? Sí. Siendo humano, Jesús necesitaba asociarse e identificarse con la comunidad de hombres y mujeres que se dedicaban a promover la causa del Reino de Dios. Necesitamos interactuar con otros hijos de Dios. Necesitamos la comunidad de fe tal como lo hizo Jesús. Necesitamos la iglesia.

¿Qué pasa con la fuerza? El Espíritu Santo, el poder del Altísimo, que descendió sobre Jesús en su bautismo, lo fortaleció y le dio poder. Fue en Su bautismo que "Dios ungió a Jesús de Nazaret con el Espíritu Santo y con poder; [y] siguió haciendo el bien y sanando a todos los oprimidos por el diablo" (Hechos 10: 37-38). El bautismo por Jesús fue un momento de auto consagración, un momento de dedicación propia. Para Él, era un compromiso hacer lo que fuera necesario para promover la causa del Reino de Dios en la tierra.

El bautismo de Jesús nos recuerda nuestra misión: experimentar la presencia de Dios dentro de nosotros, reconocer nuestra dignidad como hijos de Dios y apreciar la Presencia Divina en los demás al honrarlos, amarlos y servirlos con toda humildad. Este también es un día para renovar nuestras promesas bautismales, consagrándonos a la Santísima Trinidad y "rechazando a Satanás y todas sus promesas vacías", que nuestro mundo profano nos ofrece constantemente a través de sus medios de comunicación.

¿Qué estamos haciendo, cada uno de nosotros, para promover el Reino de Dios? ¿Estamos listos para consagrarnos y dedicarnos por completo al servicio de este Reino tal como lo hizo Jesús? Si no, ¿qué estamos haciendo para apoyar a aquellos que se han consagrado a hacer este trabajo en nombre de todos nosotros?

Permitámonos hoy, con Jesús, renovar nuestro compromiso bautismal para dar testimonio de la Buena Nueva del Reino de Dios en palabra y obra.
